REKINDLE YOUR INITIAL ZEAL-BISHOP ATTAKRUH URGES PRIESTS



Most Rev. John Baptist Attakruh, Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Sekondi-Takoradi, has urged the Priests to renew their commitment to the service of God and humanity.

In his homily during the Chrism Mass at St. Paul's Pro-Cathedral in Sekondi, Bishop Attakruh charged the Priests to make themselves readily available to meet the spiritual and pastoral needs of their flock as shepherds of the people.

He emphasized that Jesus knew his mission, that he was sent to bring glad tidings to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives, and release to prisoners reminding the Priests that since they share in the ministerial priesthood of Christ, they are equally called to serve and to give their lives for service of the people as Jesus did.

The priesthood, the Bishop noted is a gift and the Priest is called to use it wholeheartedly for service stressing that the gift enables the priest to radiate the love of Christ. He urged them to reflect on their roles as priests and how they have been Christlike to God's people.

He enjoined the Priests to reflect deeply upon their call, and what it meant to them, stressing that it will enable them to gain the strength to forge ahead with fresh enthusiasm. "Where is that zeal with which you responded"? He questioned.

The Prelate appealed to them to listen to their parishioners, know their needs and concerns, and show them the true path to holiness, to a life that is pleasing to God, reminding them of the need for people to see them as a source of relief not as a burden.

Bishop Attakruh encouraged the faithful to continue to support their Priests, praying for them and loving them despite their shortcomings, understanding that they too face challenges in their spiritual journey yet they avail themselves to attend to the needs of others..

He emphasized that God comes to us in such simple things as oil urging them to be good stewards of the mystery of God. The Bishop explained the uses of the Holy Oils of the Sick, Catechumen, and the Sacred Chrism emphasizing the need for the Priests to use them and apply them with reverence during the celebrations.

The Bishop congratulated all the Priests in the diocese for their efforts and good works, which were sometimes unnoticed and unrewarded reminding them that there is always room for improvement.

He was optimistic that as they renewed their commitments, it would be a renewal of their efforts to continue to improve. He concluded by expressing gratitude for the Priests' love and service to the church and humanity.

The highlights of the ceremony included the renewal of Ordination promises by the Priests and the blessing and consecration of Sacred Oils for use throughout the year for Baptism, Anointing of the Sick, Confirmation, Ordination, and the dedication of Churches and Altars.

Earlier in a welcome address, Very Rev. Fr. Charles Fuakye, the Administrator of the Pro-Cathedral warmly welcomed the Bishops, Most Rev. John Baptist Attakruh and Most Rev. Francis Joseph Kwaku Essien, the Priests, Religious men and women, and all present.



He noted that Chrism Mass is an annual event when the Local Ordinary concelebrates with his priests and blesses 3 Oils that would be used throughout the diocese pointing out that the Mass also emphasizes the institution of the sacred priesthood.

The Chrism Mass is an essential liturgical celebration that symbolizes the unity and mission of the diocese, the anointing of Christ, and the power of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church. It is a significant event that enriches the faith of the clergy and the faithful and strengthens their commitment to serving God and one another

30 GRADUATE FROM SKILLS LEARNING PROJECT

Most Rev. John Baptist Attakruh, the Catholic Bishop of Sekondi-Takoradi Diocese has reiterated the commitment of the Diocese to empower young people with entrepreneurial skills.

Speaking during the graduation ceremony of 30 beneficiaries of the skills learning project of the Diocesan Women Development Office of the Catholic Diocese of Sekondi-Takoradi at the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Catholic Church, Fijai, Bishop Attakruh underscores the importance of skill acquisition and self-employment in the competitive job market.

He noted that the rate of unemployment is disheartening and appealed to the youths to desist from waiting for government employment but, rather strive to be self-employed through skill acquisition urging them to explore the possibility of acquiring skills in hairdressing, interior decoration, dressmaking, baking, and other lucrative businesses.

Bishop Attakruh paid glowing tributes to Versalis Zeal Limited for partnering with the Diocese and facilitating their effort towards training the beneficiaries through their sponsorship and commended the Diocesan Coordinator for Women and Gender issues, Ms. Linda Aggrey for ensuring the success of the project.

Emphasizing the importance of putting the acquired skills into good use, the Bishop congratulated the graduates for completing their program successfully.

He commended the teachers for imparting useful knowledge and life skills to them, and prayed for God's blessings upon them.

Rev. Fr. Thomas Gyetua Boafo, the Parish Priest on behalf of the Parish extended a warm welcome to the Bishop, the graduands and all gathered. He expressed gratitude to the Diocese for empowering the youth through the project.

Dr. Grace Ayensu-Danquah, the Parliamentary Candidate for Essikado/Ketan Constituency while congratulating the graduates for the feat they attained challenged them to believe in themselves as ladies and see their achievements so far as stepping stones to greater heights. She commended the Diocese for empowering young men and women through skill acquisition programmes stressing that she was a beneficiary of Catholic Education.

The Diocesan Coordinator for Women and Gender issues, Miss Linda Aggrey traced the historical trajectory that culminated in the graduation ceremony, acknowledging the generosity of Versalis Zeal Limited. She stated that the 30 beneficiaries were drawn from the rural areas of the Diocese pointing out that among the 30 beneficiaries that graduated, 10 each acquired skills in Interior Decoration, Hairdressing, and Pastry & Bread making respectively.

The graduates were presented with certificates and items for start-up. The items included hair dryers, local ovens, and materials for interior decoration among others.

The ceremony also featured the exhibition of the products of the graduates.

The Holy Child College of Education in Takoradi hosted its 18th Matriculation Ceremony on Monday,

A breakdown of the 297 matriculated students for the four-year Bachelor of Education program shows that 59 will pursue Early Grade Education, 99 will focus on Primary Education, and 139 will specialize in JHS Education.



Sekondi-Takoradi Diocese Celebrates World Day of the Sick

The 32nd World Day of the Sick was marked with solemnity and compassion as Most Rev. John Baptist Attakruh, Bishop of the Sekondi-Takoradi Diocese, led the launch under the theme 'It is not good that man should be alone' Healing the sick by Healing Relationships.

The event, held on, Thursday, February 15, 2024, at the **Holy Child Catholic Hospital** in Fijai, witnessed a gathering of Priests, healthcare workers from the **Jubilee Catholic Hospital** in Apowa and Fijai, board members, and other stakeholders in health.

During the Eucharistic celebration preceding the launch, Bishop Attakruh emphasized the Church's mission to reach out to the sick, citing Jesus' healing ministry as an inspiration. He highlighted the Diocese's commitment to providing quality healthcare, boasting four hospitals and five clinics spread across the region.

Addressing healthcare workers, Bishop Attakruh stressed the importance of love and care in the healing process, urging them to create nurturing environments in their families and extend that love to their patients. He emphasized their calling to be instruments of God's healing mission.





Reflecting on the theme, Bishop Attakruh echoed Pope Francis's call for compassion and solidarity in caring for the sick. He urged caregivers to provide not only physical care but also emotional and psychological support, emphasizing the value of choosing life amidst societal challenges.

In his remarks, Rev. Fr. Francis Atta Aidoo, Director of the Catholic Health Service Trust of the Diocese, cautioned against discrimination and urged staff to prioritize patient care above all else. He called for a culture of accountability, respect, and professionalism to ensure the success of healthcare services.

Dr. Pius Mensah, Metro Health Director of Sekondi-Takoradi, praised the Catholic Health Service Trust for its contribution to quality healthcare in Ghana, emphasizing the divine significance of healthcare. He encouraged healthcare workers to approach their profession with passion and empathy.

FIVE ORDAINED AS TRANSITIONAL DEACONS IN SEKONDI-TAKORADI DIOCESE

The Most Rev. John Baptist Attakruh, Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Sekondi-Takoradi on Thursday, January 11, 2024 ordained five young men as transitional deacons call to them to be effective in action, active in ministry and constant in prayer.

The celebration which took place at St. Matthew's Catholic Church in Tarkwa brought together the Clergy, the Religious, the Laity and some Traditional leaders marking the solemn ceremony very colourful.

Delivering the homily on behalf of the Bishop, Very Rev. Fr. Francis LeMaire, the Vicar General of the Diocese identified three categories of the Sacrament of the Holy Orders as the episcopate, presbyterate and diaconate pointing out that the diaconate is category three.

He reminded the Deacons that though their position as deacons is transitory but their work as deacons is not transitory pointing out that their work is the basic work of the Bishop and the Priests.

Fr. LeMaire noted that the Ordinandi have been groomed & nurtured through their formation emphasizing that by imposition of hands and prayer, they will be empowered to serve the people of God. He added that the imposition of hands and prayer come with the character of readiness to serve, stressing that they will perform duties for the Bishop Priests and all the faithful, emphasizing the important role deacons play.

Fr. LeMaire noted that responding to the call of God is becoming more challenging as a result of materialism and selfishness underscoring the importance of Humility and Service.



He lamented that humility is no longer attractive in our world today as a result of quest for power emphasizing that humility and service will make them great.

He urged the Ordinandi to be men of prayer, be facilitators, urging them not to hesitate to call for back up from fellow priests, prayer warriors, experts, benefactors as they attend to the needs of the people.

The newly ordained deacons are Reverends Kyereboah Cosmas, from Aboadze, Hermans Maxwell, from Tarkwa Banso, Sarfo Alexander, from Asankra Bremang, Coffie Emmanuel, from Asankra Bremang, Adabra Hope Kelvin from Shama.

The Vicar General also appealed to the laity to continue to support the Diocese in the training of her seminarians by contribution generously through the seminary fundraising project.

Earlier in a welcome address, Very Rev. Fr. Michael Owusu Parish Priest heartily welcomed the Bishop and all present stressing that with the ordination, deacons will become the eyes and hands of the Bishop in ministering the to needs of the poor. He thanked the Bishop for choice of the the Parish as the venue for the ordination describing it as historic.



On behalf of his colleagues, Rev. Emmanuel Coffie expressed appreciation to the Bishop for ordaining them. He thanked their formators, families, parishes and all those who joined them to celebrate in their joy with prayers, counsel and their resources both human and financial.

The celebration ended with the blessing on a newly built adoration chapel for the Parish.

SEKONDI-TAKORADI DIOCESE LAUNCHES A COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH SCHEME FOR PRIESTS



The Catholic Diocese of Sekondi-Takoradi has launeed a comprehensive health scheme to cater to the healthcare needs of her diocesan priests.

Declaring the launch today at the co-workers' celebration at St. Matthew's Catholic Church, Tarkwa, Most Rev. John Baptist Attakruh explained rationale behind the health scheme, emphasizing that the Diocese is blessed with two hundred and ten (210) diocesan priests, fifty percent of whom are almost vears of age and therefore need special health care.

Bishop Attakruh explained the decision was taken after several consultations with the College of Consultors, Priests' Senate, and Diocesan Finance Council taking into account the dwindling nature of foreign aid and the need to prepare for future unforeseen occurrences. The scheme therefore seeks to prepare the Diocese to meet the health care challenges of the priests in the future.

He made a passionate appeal to the parishioners to support the laudable initiative by contributing the sum of two hundred Ghana Cedis (200 GHC) for each of the priests working in their parish monthly. This contribution, he said will be saved in a dedicated bank account for five years and used to cater for the welfare of the ailing and aged priests.

Addressing mental health, Mrs. Josephine Oppong Amissah defined it as emotional well-being affecting one's thoughts, actions, and reactions.


She highlighted various causes of mental health issues such as relationship problems, stress, loss, procrastination, anxiety, and confusion.

Declining Catholic Population, Soaring Religious and Priests - Fr. Blay, OFM, Asks Why?

The African Religious Union of Ghana (ARUG) commenced activities marking the climax of their Golden Jubilee celebration dubbed ARUG @ 50 with an opening ceremony held at Christ the King Catholic Church, Effiakuma.

In his keynote address on the theme, ARUG beyond 50: The role of the African Religious in Evangelisation in Ghana, Rev. Fr. Joseph Blay, OFM, highlighted the remarkable contribution of Indigenous Religious to the Church including 2 Bishops for Africa (Botswana & CAR), 6 Bishops for Ghana as well as many Generals and General Counsellors.

He traced the historical trajectory that culminated in what is known as ARUG today emphasizing the search for African Religious identity and mutual support as the motivating factor while paying glowing tributes to the Pioneer Indigenous Religious.

Fr. Blay emphasized that evangelization entails "Bringing the Good News into all strata of humanity and through it transforming humanity itself from within its criteria of discernment, its determinant values, its sources of inspiration, its designs for living, opening them up to a total vision of humanity."

Drawing attention to the unsettling trend unveiled by the 2021 Population and Housing Census that showed a decline in the Catholic population vis-avis the phenomenal increase in Priests and Religious in the last 50 years, Fr. Blay asked the question what are religious men and women not doing right?

This question was necessitated by the paradoxical growth of religion that is not reflected in the growth of Catholic numbers. He noted that the trend of a 2.5% loss of Catholics every 10 years is worrisome adding that if not checked, there may be no Catholic in Ghana by 2060.

Fr. Blay outlined the numerous challenges facing the indigenous Religious as sustenance and self-reliance, family demands and expectations, knowledge and use of the vernacular, pentecostalism, and relationship with Diocesan Bishops.

He made several practical recommendations as a way forward, including the need for redefinition of the Union, consolidation of communion, direct pastoral involvement, relationship with Parish Priests, common social mitigation programs, as well as discipline and commitment.

In conclusion, Fr. Blay stated that to survive 50 years, testify to the relevance of ARUG stressing that though the achievements of ARUG are not tabulated, they are evident.

He made a passionate appeal to the Major Superiors Conference of Ghana to help consolidate the achievements of ARUG and to solidify this union as a common forum for members of all institutes of consecrated life and apostolic societies to meet.

The opening ceremony was under the distinguished Chairmanship of Rev. Br. Prof. Michael Amakyi, CSC.




